The fact that everyone in the house had to speak English in common areas, as insisted by Mr and Mrs Taylor (the Housemaster and Housemistress), seemed to foster a sense of unity and confidence among the boarders, which I believe is a key element of the success of the boarding house.

It is truly inconceivable the range of facilities the School has for day students, but as a boarder, I find it even better. I usually go out to play football on the School fields, but boarders are also allowed to use the gym, athletics tracks, swimming pool and Courage Hall - where volleyball, badminton and basketball is normally played. When I initially arrived, I was really taken aback by this because I wasn't used to having so many amenities available for students in my old school, which made me appreciate the School even more and made me realise how lucky I was to be part of such an amazing community.

The final day of school last year stands out as one of my favourite
Hough experiences so far. Many of us said goodbye to boarders who wouldn't be returning on an emotional yet fun night. We had to get takeaway to get the energy levels up before we could have a round of brief speeches thanking everyone for the incredible year and finish the night dancing endlessly to music. It was the ideal way to say farewell to many boarders, and I even considered convincing my parents to let me resit the year so I could spend 3 years in the boarding house instead of only 2!
