The Art department has two large double classroom studios, a well-equipped ceramics studio, a digital photography studio, a screenprinting studio and a dedicated computer suite/library. Art plays a vitally important role in the artistic and creative life of the School community. The popularity of Art is evidenced by the high number of students who elect to study the subject at GCSE, IB or A Level.

Job Purpose

Food Preparation and Nutrition is taught to all pupils in Year 8 and as an option in Year 9. We offer the subject at GCSE and we offer the Food Science and Technology IB Standard Level course in the IB Diploma Programme. We also offer cooking classes as part of the Sixth Form enrichment programme during our Activity days.

The role involves teaching Art and Food & Nutrition at all key stages throughout the School and the successful candidate will be expected to contribute to the extensive support offered to students outside the classroom both at lunchtime and after school. Furthermore, all teaching staff are expected to participate fully in the wider life of the School through extracurricular involvement.

Key Responsibilities & Accountabilities

- To be an effective classroom teacher who maintains an orderly, positive and purposeful classroom atmosphere and shares good practice through regular discussion and the promotion of forward-thinking ideas.
- To plan and prepare interesting and engaging lessons and help develop students as independent learners.
- To assess, record and report on the development, progress and attainment of students.
- To be a team player and work well with others.
- To safeguard the general health and safety of students and actively share and support the pastoral wellbeing of the student body.
- To promote the general progress and well-being of individual students and of any assigned group of students, including tutor groups.
- To contribute to departmental schemes of work.
- To communicate with and consult parents and any relevant outside bodies or agencies.
- To participate in all relevant meetings and undertake supervision and cover duties as required.
- To contribute to other aspects of education outside the classroom, e.g. games, clubs and visits.

Personal Specification

The successful candidate will be deeply committed to the success of every student studying Art and Food & Nutrition within the School, have an understanding of current educational thinking a and an innovative approach towards future developments in the subject area. Candidates need to have a relevant degree (PGCE not essential). We will consider well-qualified applicants with or without a PGCE.





Candidates will also need to have a clear understanding of the Food Safety and Hygiene standards. Experience of teaching Art and/or Food & Nutrition to Key Stage 5 would be desirable, but not essential.

Safeguarding responsibilities
